Privacy notice for School Governors and other volunteers

The Lady Margaret and Durdan's Park Schools' Federation is committed to protecting the privacy and security of your personal information.

Under data protection law, individuals have a right to be informed about how the schools in the Federation use any personal data held about them. The Federation complies with this right by providing 'privacy notices' (sometimes called 'fair processing notices') to individuals where the Federation is processing their personal data.

This privacy notice explains how the Federation collects, stores and uses personal data about individuals working with the schools in the Federation in a voluntary capacity, including governors.

Who collects this information?

Lady Margaret Primary and Durdan's Park schools are separate 'data controllers' for the purposes of data protection law.

Data protection principles

The Federation will comply with the data protection principles when gathering and using personal information, as set out in the Federation's data protection policy.

The personal data we hold

The Federation processes data relating to those volunteering at our schools. Personal data that we may be collected, used, stored and shared (when appropriate) about you includes, but is not restricted to:

- Contact details
- References
- Evidence of qualifications
- Employment details
- Information about business and pecuniary interests

- Attendance information
- Images of volunteers/governors engaged in school activities

The Federation may also collect, store and use information about you that falls into “special categories” of more sensitive personal data. This may include information about (where applicable):

- Race, ethnicity, religious beliefs, sexual orientation and political opinions
- Disability and access requirements

Why we use this data

The purpose of processing this data is to support the Federation to:

- Establish and maintain effective governance
- Meet statutory obligations for publishing and sharing governor details
- Facilitate safe recruitment, as part of our safeguarding obligations towards pupils
- Undertake equalities monitoring
- Ensure that appropriate access arrangements can be provided for volunteers who require them

Our lawful basis for using this data

The Federation only collects and uses personal information about you when the law allows it to. Most commonly, we use it where we need to:

- Comply with a legal obligation
- Carry out a task in the public interest

Less commonly, we may also use personal information about you where:

- You have given us consent to use it in a certain way
- We need to protect your vital interests (or someone else’s interests)
- We have legitimate interests in processing the data which we would discuss with you.

Where you have provided us with consent to use your data, you may withdraw this consent at any time. We will make this clear when requesting your consent, and explain how you go about withdrawing consent if you wish to do so.

Some of the reasons listed above for collecting and using personal information about you overlap, and there may be several grounds which justify our use of your data.

Collecting this information

While the majority of the information we collect from you is mandatory, there is some information that you can choose whether or not to provide to us.

Whenever we seek to collect information from you, we make it clear whether you must provide this information (and if so, what the possible consequences are of not complying), or whether you have a

choice.

How we store this data

Personal data is stored in accordance with our data protection policy and is in line with follows good practice guidelines in regards to the maintaining of records

We maintain a file to store personal information about all volunteers. The information contained in this file is kept secure and is only used for purposes directly relevant to your work with the school.

When your relationship with the school has ended, we will retain and dispose of your personal information in accordance with our good practice guidelines.

Data sharing

We do not share information about you with any third party without your consent unless the law and our policies allow us to do so.

Where it is legally required, or necessary (and it complies with data protection law) we may share personal information about you with:

- Government departments or agencies – to meet our legal obligations to share information about governors/trustees
- Our local authority – to meet our legal obligations to share certain information with it, such as details of governors
- Suppliers and service providers – to enable them to provide the service we have contracted them for, such as governor/trustee support
- Professional advisers and consultants
- Employment and recruitment agencies
- Police forces, courts

Security

We have put in place measures to protect the security of your information (i.e. against it being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way). In addition, we limit access to your personal information to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need to know. Details of these measures are available in the school security policy.

Third parties will only process your personal information on our instructions and where they have agreed to treat information confidentially and to keep it secure.

We have put in place procedures to deal with any suspected data security breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected breach where we are legally required to do so.

Use of your personal information for marketing purposes

Where you have given us consent to do so, the school may send you marketing information by e-mail or text or through social media, promoting school events, campaigns, charitable causes or services that may be of interest to you. You can "opt out" of receiving these texts and/or e-mails at any time by contacting the school office office@ladymargaret.ealing.sch.uk.

Your rights

How to access the personal information we hold about you

Individuals have a right to make a 'subject access request' to gain access to personal information that the school holds about them.

If you make a subject access request, and if we do hold information about you, we will:

- Give you a description of it
- Tell you why we are holding and processing it, and how long we will keep it for
- Explain where we got it from, if not from you
- Tell you who it has been, or will be, shared with
- Let you know whether any automated decision-making is being applied to the data, and any consequences of this
- Give you a copy of the information in an intelligible form

You may also have a right for your personal information to be transmitted electronically to another organisation in certain circumstances.

Your other rights regarding your data

Under data protection law, individuals have certain rights regarding how their personal data is used and kept safe. You have the right to:

- Object to the use of your personal data if it would cause, or is causing, damage or distress
- Prevent your data being used to send direct marketing
- Object to the use of your personal data for decisions being taken by automated means (by a computer or machine, rather than a person)
- In certain circumstances, have inaccurate personal data corrected, deleted or destroyed, or restrict processing
- Claim compensation for damages caused by a breach of the data protection regulations

How to Raise a Concern

If you have a concern about the way we are collecting or using your personal data, we ask that in the first instance you raise your concern with Amanda Hancock who will aim to resolve any query you raise about our use of your information.
